

Guidelines for Make-Up Work

Some students have created poor work habits and are not turning in work by the deadline. They expect teachers to take missed work at any point during the grading period. This practice is NOT going to continue. The following guidelines will be enforced for turning in late assignments or making up tests/projects.

For excused absences, students will have 3 days to make up work for full credit. If a student has been out multiple days, additional time may be given.

If a student missed a deadline for work, test and/or project for a reason other than an excused absence, then it is the student's responsibility to communicate with the teacher and request to make up work. **This must be done within 5 days of the due date and the student will only be eligible to receive 70%. A student will not be allowed to make up work beyond 5 days of the due date.**

It is our goal for students to develop and demonstrate effective time management practices. This begins with students understanding the importance of deadlines for work and/or projects. Agendas were provided to all students as a means of recording important deadlines and as a tool for keeping parents aware of upcoming events. Please be diligent in reviewing your student's agenda.
